


## **School Lunches**



Our cook and catering staff work incredibly hard to provide hundreds of meals each day from reception to year six, and often for staff too! With that amount of lunches, timely preparation is key! Up until now, children who are late for school would be allocated a green lunch choice so that the lunch staff can increase on one option rather than four options and it is manageable in the short time they have to make all our lunches!

We have improved our system which means that lead time is now less than it was, children can now choose from the full menu up to 9.30am. After 9.30am a school lunch choice would be a green choice. Our menu is below for next week, our full menu is on the website.

Study Bugs is a fantastic app and we encourage you to sign up for it!



**National Child Measurement** Programme (NCMP)

The National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) is available for all children in Reception and Year 6 who attend a school under Leeds City Council. This is offered by the 0-19 Public Health Integrated Nursing Service.

The NCMP involves measuring your child's height and weight to calculate their BMI. They will remain fully clothed, but will be asked to remove their shoes. No individual measurements will be given to school staff or other children and all the information we gather will be treated confidentially. Your child's results will be sent

to you through the post. It will not be shared with the school without

**National Child Measurement** Programme (NCMP) and

All children in a Leeds reception class get an important health check whilst in school. This is called the **National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP)** 

> The NCMP involves measuring your child's height and weight to calculate their BMI', and to carry out a distance vision screening

> > Issues with either might affect your child's learning, development and achievements and is offered so we can spot any problems.

Your child's results will be sent to you and will not be shared with your child or school. The results will be included in the letter and we will tell you if your child needs further

eyesight tests. You may be asked to go to a local optician or your child may be referred to the Community Eye Clinic. Please note the service does not screen for squints

If your child is allergic to Durapore (surgical sticking tape), you want more information about the height, weight and eye screening or if you **DO NOT** want your child to have eye screening or be included in the NCMP offer, please telephone our 0-19 Admin SPA on 0113 843 5683 to tell us.

# Free School Meals



All children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 at a state funded school or academy, will automatically get free school meals through the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme. Parents do not need to make an application to receive these meals.

If you receive benefits and your child already gets Universal Infant Free School Meals, you should still register for free school meals. This is so school can claim funding to support your child at school. This is called Pupil Premium.

Children in Year 3 or above, are only eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers are entitled to benefits, and they make an application for free school meals. Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

\*If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.\*

If you live in Leeds and you do not already receive Housing Benefit or Council Tax Support, you will need to complete the <u>online form</u> to claim for Free School Meals.

# Changes and Messages

If you need to change your pick up arrangements, please call the office as soon as possible and before 2.00pm so we have time to deliver the many messages we receive. Please ensure it is a parent who makes this call and gives the full name of the person picking up. If you wish for your child to go to afterschool club, please ensure the request is with us before 2.00pm so we can inform the afterschool club team to expect them. Delivering messages to children in class time can be disruptive to the lesson, please help us keep this to a minimum by organising arrangements as early as possible. Thank you for your understanding!

We would like to remind all children and parents that children are not permitted to bring footballs or other balls into school and should not be playing football on the bottom playground before the start of the school day. If children are coming onto the site without an adult (year 5 and 6 only), they must wait sensibly by their year group doors or be accompanied by an adult. Thank you for your understanding.


# ParentMail Payments Help Guide




We use ParentMail for payments, consents, forms and booking appointments for parents evening, so it's really important to get connected if you aren't already. Email office@whitecote.co.uk and we'll arrange for an activation link to be sent. We've added a quick guide to payments below, if you have ParentMail but struggle to use it.




To access the main menu, use the three lines to the left hand side of the app or webpage. You will then have access to the menu as shown on the right.



In the Accounts section you will be able to make payment towards school meals, Breakfast Club and After School Club (childcare) simply click on the relevant child account, and select the top up button, enter the amount you wish to top up, add to basket then check out as you would with any online shopping.







To pay for one off special school meals, school trips and milk, use the Payments section from the main menu. You will then need to select the Shop tab at the bottom of the screen.



Once in the shop tab you will see all items available for purchase. Click on the item to see more info and pay.



Choose to add to basket (if you have multiple items/multiple children to add items for) or pay now to be taken straight to checkout.



Some items, such as trips require you to give consent before you can checkout. To do this click the parental consent slide button.

From the basket/ pay now option you can then check out as you would online shopping.
