




Writing

As children's phonetic knowledge increases, so will their ability to write. Children will start by learning to hold a pencil properly, and then turning this into writing simple words before writing some simple sentences near the end of reception. Children will be able to make a sensible guess as to how to spell words based on their phonic knowledge.



Phonics and Reading

Children will follow Floppy's Phonics Reading Programme to learn the individual sounds ('code's') that are needed to make up words. They will learn how to segment the sounds in words, before blending them back together to make a word. This will help them with their writing. They will listen to lots of stories being read to them from around the world and that take them to different places. This will support their understanding of the world.



Numeracy

Children will build on their knowledge of numbers by learning about numbers 1-10 and counting beyond 20. We will also learn how to add and subtract numbers 1-10.

Understanding the World





Our past and present curriculum provides an early foundation for our young historians. Children will look at the changes they have experienced in their lives, as well as looking at the changes over time of things that they are familiar with, such as toys and ways that we travel.

All children as part of their induction to reception will learn basic fieldwork sills by looking around our school grounds. We will spend lots of time making maps and learning about our local environment. Children will also learn about different places and communities around the world in the stories we read.

Children will begin to develop early working scientifically skills from the national curriculum by asking questions and describing what they have seen. We will experience lots of scientific phenomena in the real world, such as the seasons and weather.







Expressive Arts and Design

We will continue our work from nursery by learning how to mix our own colours and make repeating patterns. We will apply our learning of concepts like colour to making Rangoli patterns or autumnal paintings.

Gluing, sticking, and cutting will be important skills that we continue to develop with more accuracy. Children will learn how to build and construct with more detail and purpose. They will make characters to help them tell stories that they have read or experienced.

As with nursery, children will sing lots of songs each day that will support their learning across other areas. They will also learn the song All You Need Is Love by The Beatles for our Best of British week. They will start to learn how to move in time to music and attend dance workshops throughout the year.
