Curriculum Information

Literacy, including Communication and Language

We will be reading lots of different books in order to learn about different places in the world. Some of the books we will be reading are: My Granny Went to Market, Handa's Surprise, and Snail and the Whale.

Phonics

We will be recapping lots of sounds that we have already learnt, as well as learning new code: sh, th, ng, dge, ve, wh, cks, tch, and nk.

Maths

We will be continuing our work understanding the value of numbers to 10. We will be learning about addition and subtraction, as well as length and height.

PE
