Vocabulary

draw	Making lines on paper
sketch	A rough drawing
design	A plan or pattern
create	Make something
texture	The surface of something. E.g smooth, rough etc.
tone	The quality of colour and whether it creates an effect of warm, cold, bright, dull, light or dark
expression	Words or feeling that the artist is trying to convey in the artwork
pattern	Repetition of elements
depth	Creating a 3-dimensional look in a 2-dimensional surface
movement	The effect created by some artists using diagonal and curved lines
foreground	Part of the picture nearest to the front. Can appear larger.
middle ground	The part of the picture that is between the foreground and the background
background	Part of the picture furthest from the viewer.

What is mixed media artwork?

Mixed media artwork is artwork that involves mixing 2 or more art forms. Texture, tone and pattern can create different moods and movement in art.



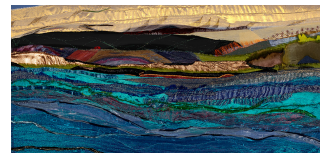
Key Artists



David Hockney is a worldwide famous artist from Bradford. He was a popular contributor the 'pop art' movement of the 1960s. **Hockney** is interested in using paint to capture transparent materials such as **water**, and the splash.



Annie Bielecka Jones is a Welsh artist who uses **textiles** such as silk, satin and metallic fibres to create landscapes and water features.



What is Appliqué?

Applique is a technique to incorporate textiles into a mixed media work.
