What is a portrait?

A portrait is a painting, drawing, photograph, or engraving of a person, usually only showing the face or head and shoulders.

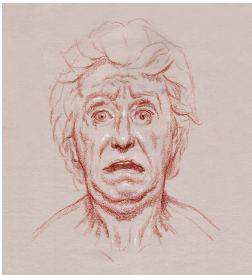


Viking portraits

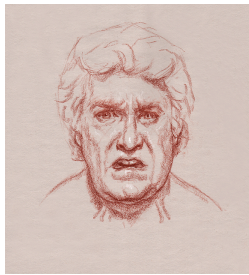
In books and media Vikings are portrayed as being fierce and brave. Some Viking were also likely to have also felt fear. These emotions are shown on your face. They wore armour and helmets when invading and attacking and this often features in art work.

Different mediums may be better to use to create different emotions and facial expressions.

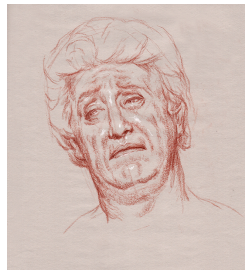
How to draw facial expressions

Draw	Using a pencil to draw a picture, pattern or diagram.
Sketch	A drawing that is done quickly without much detail.
Design	Design a piece of art by planning, preparing and deciding on the details of it.
Create	To make something.
Texture	The way something feels when you touch it rough or smooth etc.
Tone	Lightness or darkness of a colour.
Expression	Art that reflects our inner feelings.
Pencil 2B, 4B, 6B	A soft pencil producing a darker mark on paper (6B being the softest)
Pencil 2H, 4H, 6H	A hard pencil producing a lighter mark on paper (6H being the hardest)
