Curriculum Information



English

In English children will be learning a range of creative literary devices through our study of the text Goodnight Mr Tom. In addition to this, we will be writing non fiction texts such as newspaper reports, non chronological reports and letters all based around our subject of WW2. We will continue to develop our understanding of grammar, focussing on clauses, apostrophes and determiners as well as consolidating our spelling patterns



Maths

In maths, we will begin by consolidating our place value knowledge and applying this to convert between units of measure. After we will move on to ratios before then beginning our first look at algebra, number function and eventually simple formula.



Science

Our science topic will be light this half term. Children will have the opportunity to learn about how light travels, how it is measured and various process including refraction and reflection. Children will have the opportunity to plan their own investigations into how light travels, while observing how light shapes the days, and seasons and the interactions between the sun, moon and stars.



Humanities

Our topic this term will be World War 2- the first half of the terms will be looking at the historical sequencing of events leading up to and significantly affecting the outcomes of WW2; with a particular focus on the impact that the world had on children and evacuees.



Art / Design Technology

In Art, we will be critiquing and creating our own WW2 propaganda including looking at typography and graphics, slogans and colour to symbolise ideas.



PE

Our indoor PE this term will be handball, children will develop their hand eye coordination supporting their throwing and catching skills, cooperative strategies and accuracy. In outdoor PE, we will be building our tennis skills, developing backhands, lob shots, doubles play and improving tactics.



Computing

In ICT, children will be developing a healthy use of social media platforms through blogging including doing their own creating their own blogs and

podcasts.



Other

In music, children will continue with their ukulele lessons every Thursday afternoon. In RE, children will be developing their understanding of Sikhism, including how Sikhs show commitment to God in their daily life and in celebration.
