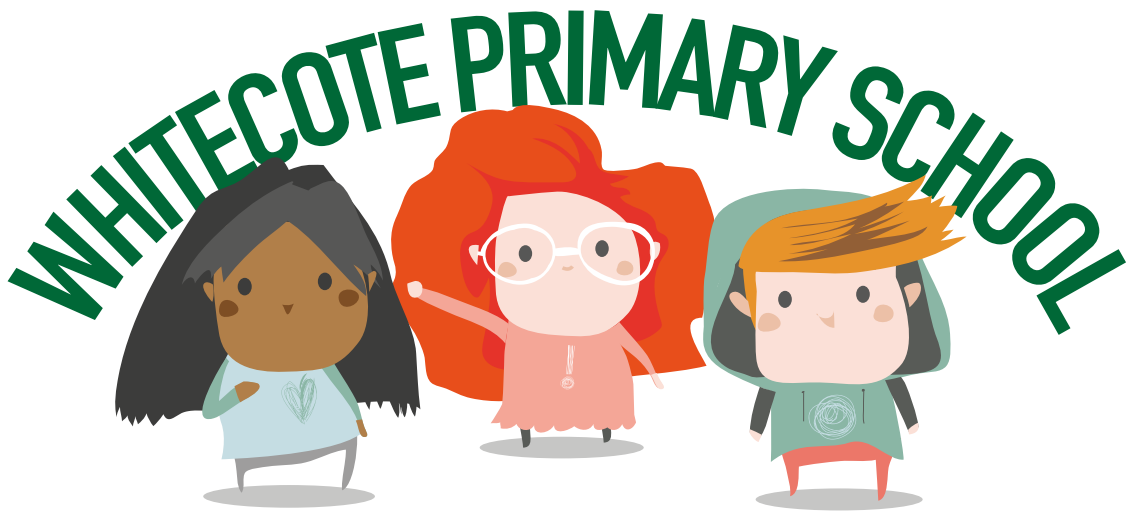

Our School Aims and Values

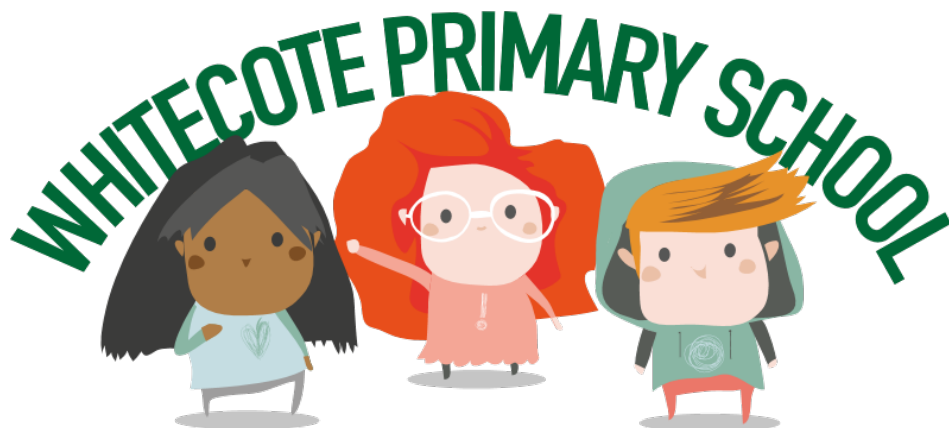
Our three school core values are:

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:



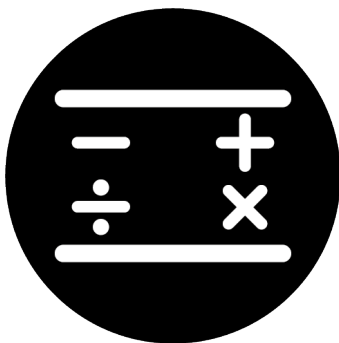
English: Writing

Children will apply their developing phonics skills in their writing. This year, we will be writing about lots of exciting school trips that we will go on, as well as writing about lots of significant people and events from history.



English: Reading

This year, children will be undertaking the phonics screening check, so it is important that we are supported at home to learn all of our phonics sounds and use them in our reading and writing. Fluency is also a huge priority, and children will be taught strategies to familiarise themselves with texts to support their reading development.



Maths

We build on our learning to 20 in reception to count up to 100 both forwards and backwards. We will also be learning how to read and write these numbers, as well as counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s. This will help us with our times tables in Year 2. We will also be learning how to add and subtract with these numbers.



Science

Children build on their understanding of seasonal change from reception and nursery in order to learn more about the seasons and why they are important. Children also learn about animals, including humans, every day materials and their uses, and plants.

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:



History

This year, we will develop a better understanding of chronology, through ordering events in the lives of famous people such as Captain Cook and Amelia Earhart. We will continue to describe, compare and contrast these people, as well as artefacts that were important to them. We will also look at the historical importance of castle and visit Skipton Castle to support our learning.



Geography

Similar to science, we will look at seasonal change and weather in geography. This helps us start to understand the variation in climates and regions around the world. We will look at different environments such as deserts, and name the different continents and oceans. We will take a trip to Scarborough to learn more geographical knowledge (and to paddle in the sea).



Art

Children will explore the textures of different autumnal leaves and use these to make repeating patterns and tones with paint. Children will also understand about collage, and how piecing different materials together can create a specific effect. On our seaside trip, we will apply our art skills to sketching our local environment.



Design Technology

Throughout this year, we will have a focus on cooking and nutrition, to teach children the necessary skills for later life. Children will enjoy making fruit kebabs from a selection of fruits, as well as talking about what makes a healthy diet. Children will also make wheeled vehicles with a working axel.

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:



Languages

Although languages is not compulsory in our year group, we do learn how to respond to adults during register time in different languages.



Music

We have redesigned our music curriculum this year to be more in line with the rest of our curriculum. We will learn the song 'We Will Rock You' as part of our Best of British week. Children will also learn about rhythm and pitch, as well as tempo. We will also experience music from around the world.



Physical Education

We have a variety of opportunities to develop different skills. Children will also learn simple basic skills such as correct technique for throwing and catching. We will also play some simple games with basic rules for children to understand.



Computing

Using the software Purple Mash, we will develop some simple coding skills and apply them to simple games. Keeping safe online will be a fundamental part of our computing curriculum so that children understand the dangers of using computers and how to guard against these.

Religious Education

Through our RE lessons, we will continue to develop respect and understanding for different religions, focusing this year on Judaism, Sikhism, Islam, and Christianity.



PSHE

As we are starting OPaL, pupils will be required to wear Wellington boots to access our muddier areas such as the wildlife area.

These will be stored in school on a welly trolley specifically for each class from Reception to Year 6.

Please ensure they are labelled clearly with your child's name and class.

If your child is unable to bring their own wellies, they will be eligible to borrow from our spare sets. If you have any spare wellies, they can be donated to build up our spare stock.

We will also have a supply of rain suits in school for year groups to access muddier areas but not enough to cover one per child. If your child has an all-in-one rain suit, they can bring this to school with their name and class clearly labelled inside the suit.
