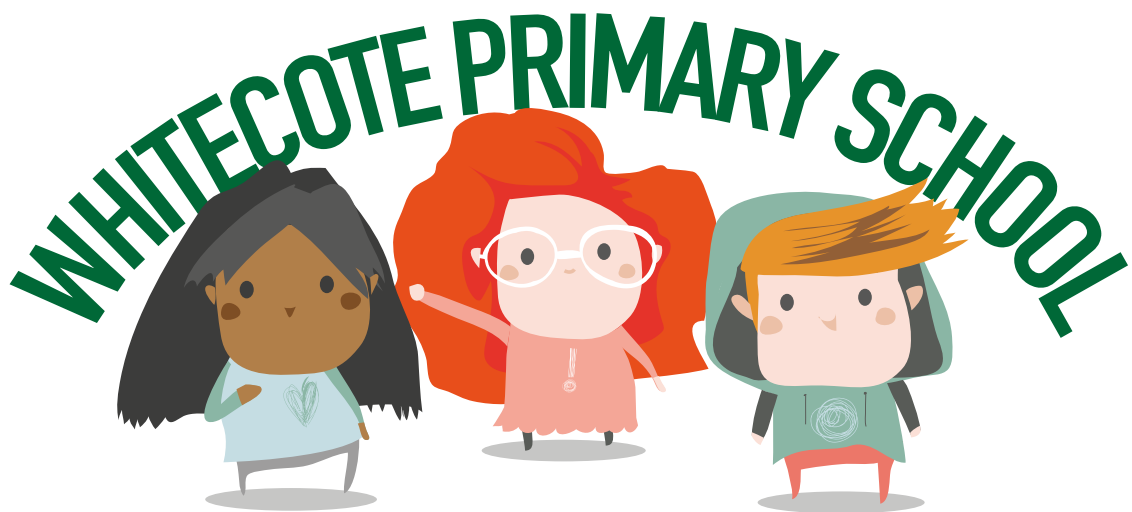

Our School Aims and Values

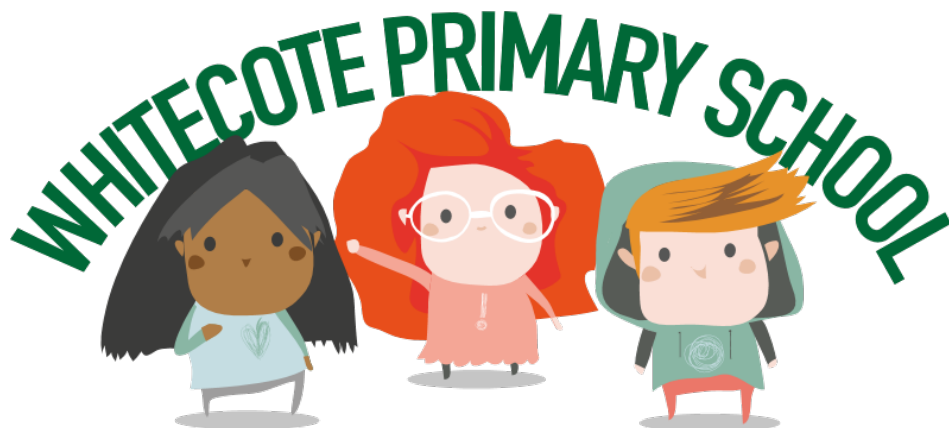
Our three school core values are:

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:



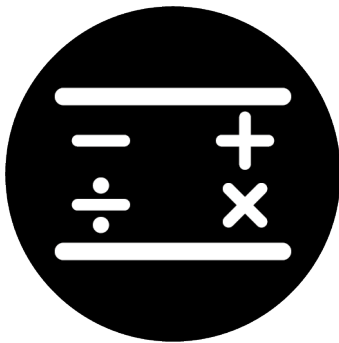
English: Writing

Children will continue to develop their understanding of different spelling patterns, as well as increasing their grammar knowledge. There will be a focus on specific grammar such as conjunctions, adverbs, and prepositions. Children will also learn how to use direct speech and speech marks.



English: Reading

We have added more books this year for our children to study. Children will be looking at a range of books, including The Iron Man, Charlotte's Web, and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Children will study these texts, and others, to develop their reading fluency and responses to inferential and retrieval questions. They will also make predictions about what they have read, while summarising the text in their own words.



Maths

Children will continue to build on their increasing range of numbers, counting in a variety of ways up to 100. They will learn how to problem solve using mental arithmetic strategies. They will also learn more about fractions and measurement. Children will focus on 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 8s, and 10s times tables, which will provide the foundations for their multiplication check in Year 4.



Science

Building on from our learning in Year 3, children will continue to look at Animals, including humans, including how animals can be classified. Children will also learn more about plants, learning how water is transported within them and the importance of each part. They will also look at light and the different types of rocks.

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:

History



From Year 3 onwards, our history curriculum will be taught chronologically. At the start of Year 3, we will step back in time to the earliest recorded evidence of the human species, looking at the three eras of the Stone Age, advancing in time to the Iron Age. We will also look at two historical, ancient civilisations of Ancient Egypt and Ancient Greece and their impact and importance on today. This provides the foundations for our learning in Year 4.

Geography



To support our learning in history and to develop geographical-enquiry skills, children will learn about different places around the world including Egypt and Greece. We will learn how to compare and contrast these places with our local environment. Children will develop fieldwork skills and understand how to read maps on a global scale.

Art



Children will develop some basic art skills by looking at early cave art linked to their learning in history. They will learn how to do some basic printing and 3D mask making. To increase their knowledge of Ancient Greece, children will make 3D sculptures.

Design Technology



In order to develop our sewing skills from previous years, children will design and put together a simple toga designed linked to their learning in history. They will continue their understanding of cooking and nutrition by making sandwiches and salads.

Our Curriculum

Some of the main things that we will be learning this year are:



Languages

In our first full year of languages, children will learn some basic Spanish, including numbers from 1-20 and some simple conversational language.



Music

Children will continue using Charanga to support their music learning.



Physical Education

Children have a variety of opportunities to develop different skills. Children will use gym equipment in the school hall to practice different types of balance and movement. They will also learn some additional games from Year 2 that will support their understanding of rules and teamwork.



Computing

Using Purple Mash software, children will develop their knowledge of coding. They will also use various multimedia such as presentation software and spreadsheets.

Religious Education

Through our RE lessons, we will continue to develop respect and understanding for different religions, focusing this year on Judaism, Sikhism, Islam, and Christianity.



PSHE

Children will learn some basic first aid based on plans from St. John's ambulance. Also, they will learn about how to respect each other inside and outside of the classroom.

As we are starting OPaL, pupils will be required to wear Wellington boots to access our muddier areas such as the wildlife area.

These will be stored in school on a welly trolley specifically for each class from Reception to Year 6.

Please ensure they are labelled clearly with your child's name and class.

If your child is unable to bring their own wellies, they will be eligible to borrow from our spare sets. If you have any spare wellies, they can be donated to build up our spare stock.

We will also have a supply of rain suits in school for year groups to access muddier areas but not enough to cover one per child. If your child has an all-in-one rain suit, they can bring this to school with their name and class clearly labelled inside the suit.
