David Lloyd George



Prime Minister of UK 1916 -1922
Signed the Armistice agreement to end WW1 in 1918.

Key Knowledge

- **Remembrance Day** is the day we take time to remember those who lost their lives in the First World War and subsequent wars.
- It is held on the **11th of November**.
- It is also known **Armistice day** and **Poppy day**.
- Many people wear red **poppies** and lay **wreaths**.
- The Bramley War Memorial was unveiled on **4th August 2014**
- The Bramley Cenotaph is in **Bramley Park**.
