What I should already know

- You can use paint brushes to make marks on paper.
- You can paint on top of paint and this is called layering.

Key Knowledge

Primary Colours are colours which can be used to make other colours. The 3 primary colours are red, yellow and blue.

Secondary Colours are made from mixing the primary colours together. These are green, orange and purple.

Green is made from mixing yellow and blue.

Orange is made from mixing yellow and red.

Purple is made from mixing blue and red.

There are different shapes and size brushes. Thicker ones are used for filling in, and thinner ones are used for adding detail.
