What I should already know

The Primary colours are red, blue and yellow. Secondary colours are made from mixing together primary colours. H pencils are hard and produce a lighter mark. B pencils are soft and produce a darker mark.

Key Knowledge



Sir Quentin Blake is a famous illustrator who was born in London in 1932.

He is famous for illustrating the covers of Roald Dahl's books.

He has illustrated over 300 books including many you may not be aware of.



He uses a very rough sketch style e.g. using pencil lightly and outlining using handwriting pen (or fine liner).

Sketching is using rough lightly shaded lines to create a drawing. Outlining is using a dark pen or pencil to create a stricter outline of a drawing. When used alongside sketching can start to build up a character.
