### Key Knowledge

**Acrylic paint** is water-based fast-drying **paint** widely used by artists since the 1960s. It can be used thickly or thinly depending how much water is added to it.

**Watercolours** are paints made of pigment designed to be mixed with water.

**Haworth** is a village in City of Bradford, West Yorkshire. The Bronte sisters were from Haworth

**Monet** -14 November 1840 – 5 December 1926) was a French painter and a founder of French Impressionist painting.

**Van Gogh** was a Dutch post-impressionist painter who sold no paintings during his life but is now one of the most recognised painters in the world.

**Hockney** is perhaps best known for his serial paintings of swimming pools, portraits of friends, and verdant landscapes.

**Paul Klee** was a Swiss painter who painted the natural world using his signature expressionist style to represent space.

depth	The distance between the top and bottom or back and front of something
