If you take part in our study you get a free Amazon Fire tablet!

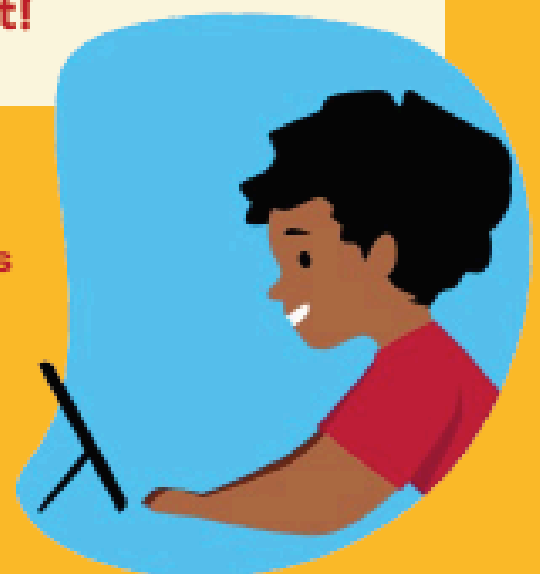
